

## The Church at Corinth – letter 1 written about AD 57 -

#### 1 Corinthians 1

<sup>11</sup> For it has been declared to me concerning you, my brethren, **by those of Chloe's household**, that there are contentions among you.

#### 1 Corinthians 7

<sup>1</sup>Now concerning the things of which you wrote to me:

#### 1 Corinthians 16

- <sup>17</sup> I am glad about the coming of Stephanas, Fortunatus, and Achaicus, for what was lacking on your part, they supplied.
- <sup>18</sup> For they refreshed my spirit and yours. Therefore acknowledge such men.

#### 1 Corinthians 11

- <sup>1</sup> Imitate me, just as I also *imitate* Christ.
- <sup>2</sup> Now I praise you, brethren, that you remember me in all things and keep the traditions just as I delivered *them* to you. <sup>3</sup> But I want you to know that the head of every man is Christ, the head of woman *is* man, and the head of Christ *is* God.
- <sup>4</sup> Every man praying or prophesying, having *his* head covered, dishonours his head. <sup>5</sup> But every woman who prays or prophesies with *her* head uncovered dishonours her head, for that is one and the same as if her head were shaved. <sup>6</sup> For if a woman is not covered, let her also be shorn. But if it is shameful for a woman to be shorn or shaved, let her be covered.

#### 1 Corinthians 11

<sup>7</sup> For a man indeed ought not to cover *his* head, since he is the image and glory of God; but woman is the glory of man. <sup>8</sup> For man is not from woman, but woman from man. <sup>9</sup> Nor was man created for the woman, but woman for the man. <sup>10</sup> For this reason the woman ought to have *a symbol of* authority on *her* head, because of the angels. <sup>11</sup> Nevertheless, neither *is* man independent of woman, nor woman independent of man, in the Lord. <sup>12</sup> For as woman *came* from man, even so man also *comes* through woman; but all things are from God.

#### 1 Corinthians 11

<sup>13</sup> Judge among yourselves. Is it proper for a woman to pray to God with her head uncovered? <sup>14</sup> Does not even nature itself teach you that if a man has long hair, it is a dishonour to him? <sup>15</sup> But if a woman has long hair, it is a glory to her; for *her* hair is given to her for a covering.

<sup>16</sup> But if anyone seems to be contentious, we have no such custom, nor *do* the churches of God.

Remember the context:-

Their lifestyle and reputation – particularly in the world.

Paul is responding to what they asked

There were three groups in the church – all were heaven bound

Authodox Jews Secular Jews

<sup>1</sup> Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ.

In this case the culture of the day is important for our understanding









#### Luke 7

- <sup>36</sup> Then one of the Pharisees asked Him to eat with him. And He went to the Pharisee's house and sat down to eat.
- <sup>37</sup> And behold, a woman in the city who was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at the table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil, <sup>38</sup> and stood at His feet behind Him weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped them with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed them with the fragrant oil.
- <sup>39</sup> Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he spoke to himself, saying, "This Man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner."
- <sup>40</sup> And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." So he said, "Teacher, say it."

#### Luke 7

<sup>41</sup> "There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. <sup>42</sup> And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?"

<sup>43</sup> Simon answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more."
And He said to him, "You have rightly judged."

<sup>44</sup> Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head. <sup>45</sup> You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. <sup>46</sup> You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. <sup>47</sup> Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little."

<sup>48</sup> Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

<sup>1</sup> Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ.

#### 1 Corinthians 11

<sup>7</sup> For a man indeed ought not to cover his head, since he is the image and glory of God; but woman is the glory of man.

- <sup>8</sup> For man is not from woman, but woman from man.
- <sup>9</sup> Nor was man created for the woman, but woman for the man.
- <sup>10</sup> For this reason the woman ought to have a **symbol of authority** on her head, because of the angels.
- <sup>11</sup> Nevertheless, neither is man independent of woman, nor woman independent of man, in the Lord.
- <sup>12</sup> For as woman came from man, even so man also comes through woman; but all things are from God.

## **Ephesians 5**

- Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. <sup>23</sup> For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Saviour of the body.
- <sup>24</sup> Therefore, just as the church is subject to Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything.
- Himself for her, <sup>26</sup> that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, <sup>27</sup> that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. <sup>28</sup> So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself.

## **Ephesians 5**

<sup>29</sup> For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church. <sup>30</sup> For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones. <sup>31</sup> "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." <sup>32</sup> This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church.

<sup>33</sup> Nevertheless **let each one of you** in particular so **love his own wife** as himself, and let the wife see that she **respects** her husband.

#### 1 Corinthians 11

<sup>13</sup> Judge among yourselves. Is it proper for a woman to pray to God with her head uncovered?

<sup>14</sup> Does not even nature itself teach you that if a man has long hair, it is a dishonour to him? <sup>15</sup> But if a woman has long hair, it is a glory to her; for her hair is given to her for a covering.

<sup>16</sup> But if anyone seems to be contentious, we have no such custom, nor do the churches of God.
